NeevJivan Foundation works with a focus on skill development and vocational training for the tribal community in rural Maharashtra. It is our endeavour to create alternate sources of income and opportunities of sustainable livelihood for them in the villages so that they do not have to migrate to the cities in search of better opportunities.

In the month of November, we trained over 75 women on vocations of choice and inaugurated 3 projects.

This was our second session with the micro businesses at Nashik

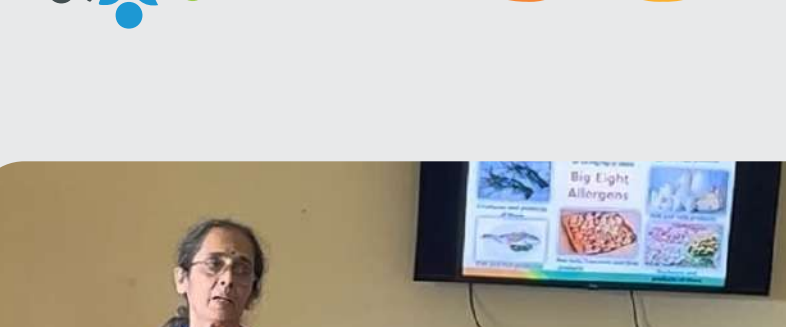

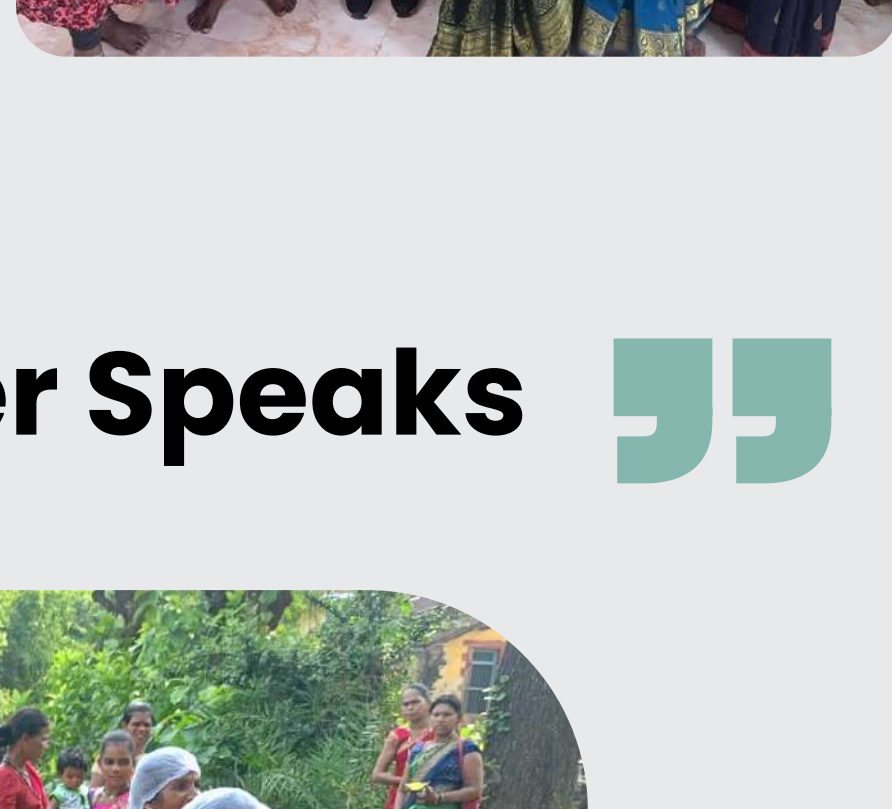
## Training on Food Safety by FICSI
