From the Founder's Desk

NeevJivan Foundation is a registered Section 8 company working in the area of Skill Development & Vocational Training for our fellow citizens in rural India. We work with the primary objective of creating opportunities for sustainable livelihood for the women and youth living in these areas.

We started our operations on 26th January 2021 from Adivasi High School in Walvanda, a small village in the predominantly tribal Jawhar taluka in the Palghar district of Maharashtra.

It all started with the images of the desperate migrant workers returning home being splashed across various media at the onset of the dreaded pandemic last year.... It was then that I made up my mind that a genuine attempt must be made to ensure that they don't go back to the cities in search of livelihood.

This obviously meant that their skills had to be mapped and they had to be skilled / re-skilled / up-skilled in such a manner that they got absorbed in the industries present in their locality or they set up enterprises of their own - the whole objective was to make them capable enough to get employed closer to their homes so that they never lived as migrants ever again.

As we started our journey to build a comprehensive training module for our students, our first stop was at the doorsteps of our stakeholders, i.e., migrant workers, local youth, government officials, bank officials and many more.

Our value proposition emerged through the multiple rounds of discussions that we had with them, i.e., to be the bridge between the aspirations of the local people and the skills required to build a successful career / enterprise so that each and every person trained by our organization gets gainfully employed or able to start an enterprise in the long run. Today, NeevJivan Foundation runs a market aligned vocational training and entrepreneurship curricula to help the migrant workers, local youth and women with the primary objective of getting them employed or start an entrepreneurial journey.

We take immense pride in the holistic approach to our work - We engage with our students not just for skill development, placement support and arrange funding to start their business, but also help them develop a mindset for long term and successful career through our effective counseling sessions and mentorship modules.



Inaugural Program



NeevJivan Foundation was inaugurated on the auspicious occasion of the 72nd Republic Day of India on 26th January 2021 by Prof. Pradipta Banerji, Professor of Civil Engineering, IIT Bombay. It was a house full inaugural session attended by Sarpanch's of most of the villages in the vicinity of the institute, teachers of the Adivasi High School and our Directors.

The program started with the traditional lighting of the lamp followed by Ma Saraswati vandana by the students of the school. The directors set the ball rolling explaining the scope of work of NeevJivan Foundation and our plans for the next one year.... and the tree plantation ceremony marked the start of our new journey....

The program has been built grounds up with feedback from all stakeholders... we can proudly proclaim that it is "of the people, for the people and by the people". We look forward to a long and impactful engagement at the institute in the days to come...



Classes commence for Agriculture & Allied Enterprises





Our first batch of classes commenced in February 21 for the students who wanted to understand more about agriculture and allied enterprises.

While teachers from Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Dahanu (our Knowledge Partner) came regularly to impart training on the technical aspects of agriculture and poultry, we also conducted classes on basics of Entrepreneurship so that our students could get ready to start a small-scale business related to their chosen vocation of their own.

The curriculum comprised of 3 days of technical training, followed by a field trip to KVK, Dahanu to get a first-hand understanding of the challenges related to their chosen vocation, which was then followed by handing over of starter-kits (packets of seeds in case of agriculture and 20 chicks in case of poultry) to enable the students to experience the process of starting a small-scale unit on their own. The 2 follow up sessions were also conducted by the KVK team to help them resolve all their practical doubts.

At the end of the 60 days of learning, all students were given certificates by KVK. We are also facilitating loans from local banks to help our students start a new source of livelihood for themselves and their families.

Today, we teach a batch of 15-20 farmers and students about agriculture and allied enterprises every quarter.



Community Tailoring Center





Our Community Computer Center was inaugurated by Mrs. Geeta Duttagupta, Director of IMCO Alloys, Mumbai. With 10 mechanical and 2 electronic sewing machines, the center has a capacity of conducting classes for 20 students per batch.

The 3 months course offers a curriculum is as per the recommendation of NSDC and is delivered by our Knowledge Partner - M/s. Yuva Parivartan. In addition to tailoring, we also conduct classes for basics of Entrepreneurship, so that our students are ready to start a small-scale business of their own.

Today, we run two batches (each comprising of 20 women) of tailoring classes every quarter.

Community Computer Center



Our Community Computer Center was inaugurated recently... The primary objective of this initiative is to propagate the awareness of the latest in the field of technology among school children in this area.

We plan to cover topics like Basics of Computers...How does Internet work? What is a browser? Which is the best Operating System? Setting up of e-Mail ID for all, Exploring Social Media, Cyberbullying, Payment Gateway & Digital Payment Options, Microsoft Office and many more....

Students of Class IX and above from any school in the Jawhar taluka are welcome to join.

In the two full months of operations till March 21 before the break out of 2nd wave of the pandemic, we were able to reach out to over 50 people through our agriculture classes, Community Tailoring Center and Community Computer Center...We hope to multiply this many times and scale up our operations in the days to come.

Note 1 General Information

NEEVJIVAN FOUNDATION has been incorporated on 1st September 2020, with objective of providing for and contributing to education, scientific research and socio-economic development in broad areas of sustainable development, women's empowerment, and Natural Resource Management to establish, conduct and maintain old age homes, school cum orphanage for needy and poor children, providing support to physically challenged men, women and children and persons with similar disabilities and also for granting assistance to institutions performing similar activities. Organising various training and development programmes and providing for grants, scholarships, fellowships and other forms of assistance to the needy and deserving students for pursuing education and vocational training.

Note 2 Summary of significant accounting policies

2.1 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention.

2.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

2.3 Cash and cash equivalents (for purposes of Cash Flow Statement)

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.4 Cash flow statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

2.5 Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its estimated residual value. Depreciation on tangible fixed assets has been provided on the WDV method as per the useful life as approved by the Management of Company.

2.6 Revenue Recognition

Revenue recognition is based on reasonable certainty of ultimate collection and completion of services rendered in accordance to AS-9. Income is accounted on Accrual Basis.

2.7 Fixed assets

Fixed assets are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of fixed assets includes incidental expenses incurred up to the of put to use.

2.8 Employee benefits

Defined contribution plans

The Company's contribution to provident fund is considered as defined contribution plans and are charged as an expense as they fall due based on the amount of contribution required to be made.

2.9 Taxes on income

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax assets in respect of unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses are recognised only if there is virtual certainty that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realise such assets.

2.10 Impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount.

2.11 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

2.12 Operating Cycle

Based on the nature of activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.
