We are thrilled to share how far we've come. We have mobilized 260 Self-Help Groups (SHGs), trained over 3,200 women in vocational and entrepreneurial skills, and set up 89 micro-businesses across 60 villages in the Palghar and Nashik districts of Maharashtra.

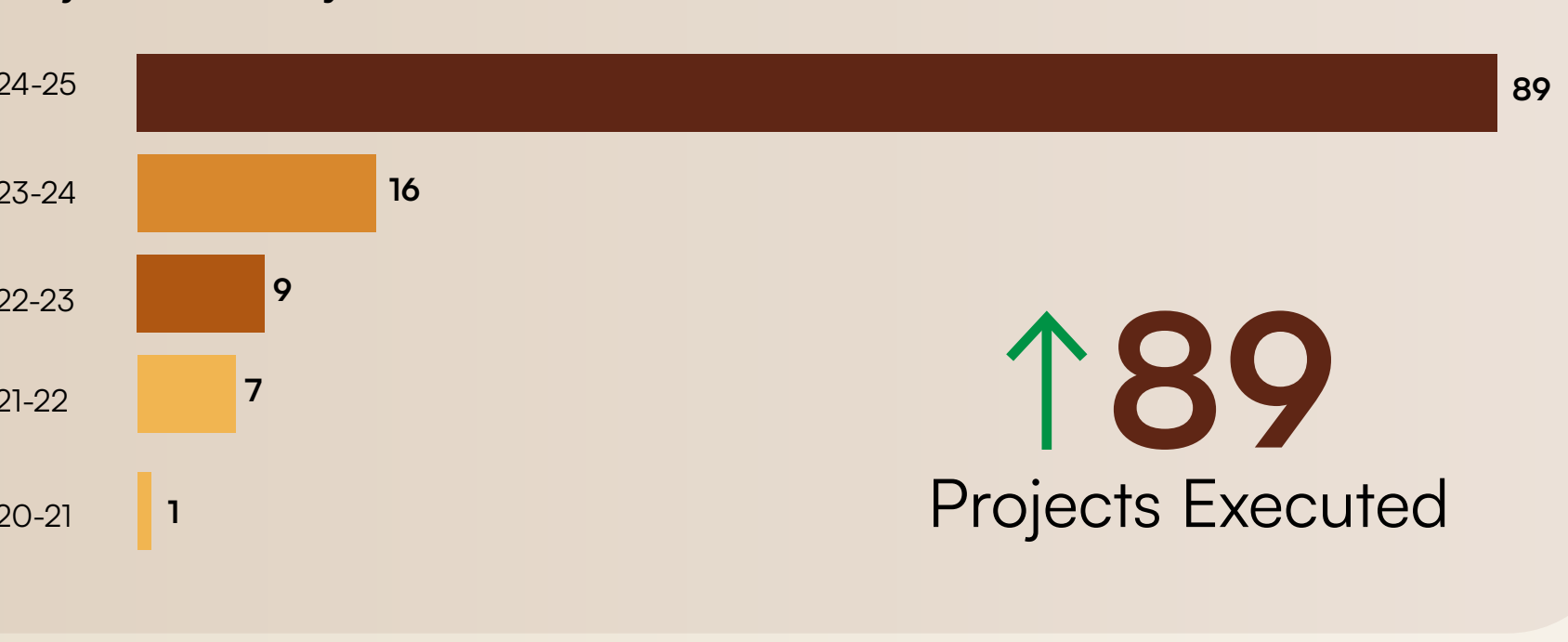


Beneficiaries taught over the years



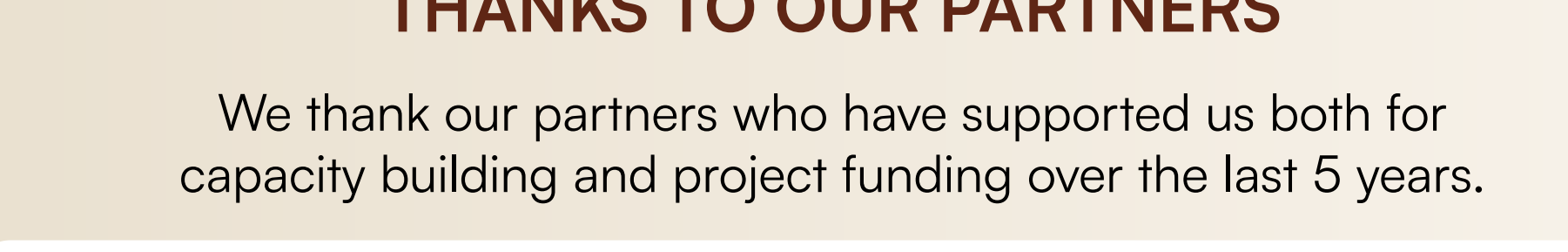

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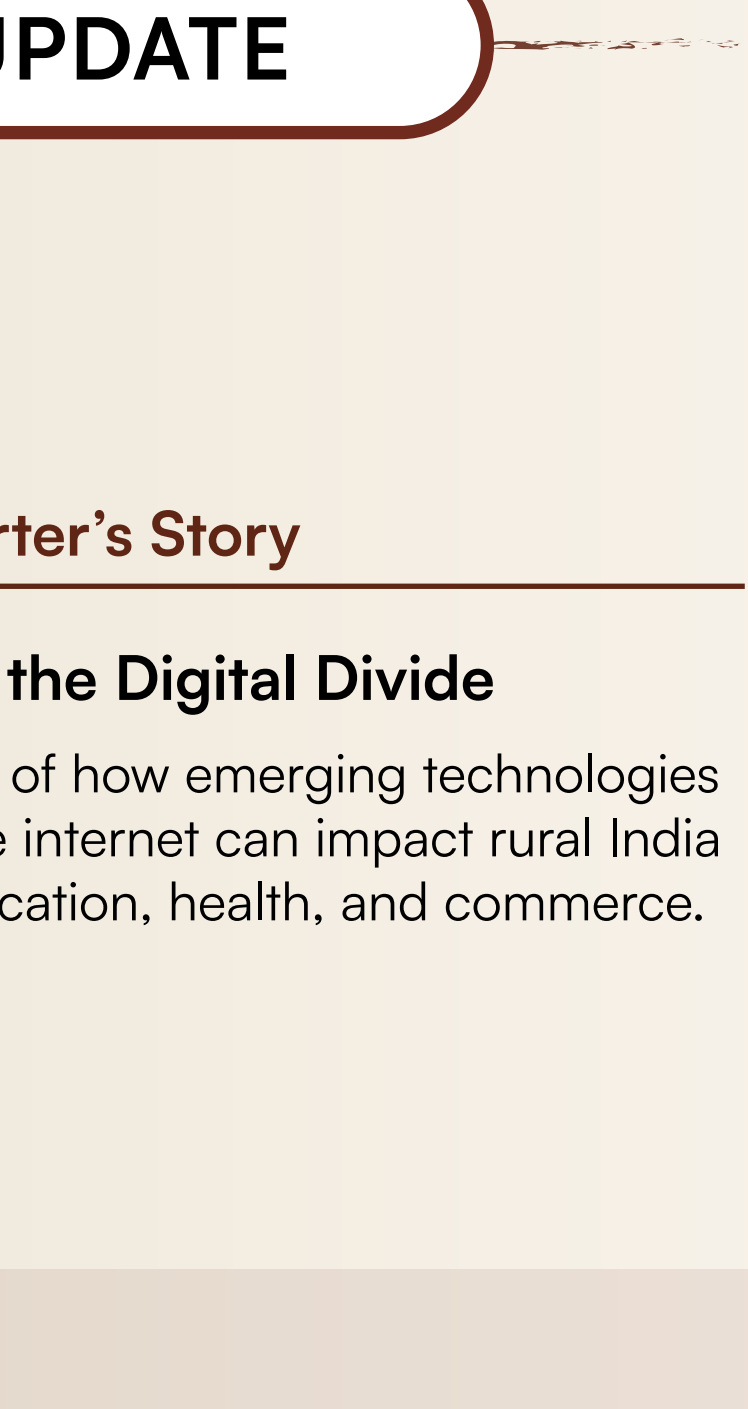

Nurturing New Beginnings

Paru & Tulshi's Story

Meet Paru and Tulshi Lotada from Chinchale village in Dahanu. Until recently, they grew just one paddy crop per year (monsoon season) because of scarce water. This small harvest (about ₹50—60k a year) meant they had to migrate for work — spending 8 months hauling bricks in Silvassa and even leaving their children behind.

“We didn’t think we could run a farm or stay with our family”



Paru recalls. Thanks to a CSR grant from payU and NeevJivan's training, just 3 months ago they learned mushroom farming. Today, their small mushroom farm is buzzing with life. They've begun earning a steady income at home, caring for their children each day. Now, Paru and Tulshi are dreaming big — talking of expanding the farm and using savings to improve their home. Their journey from hardship to hope embodies why we do this work.

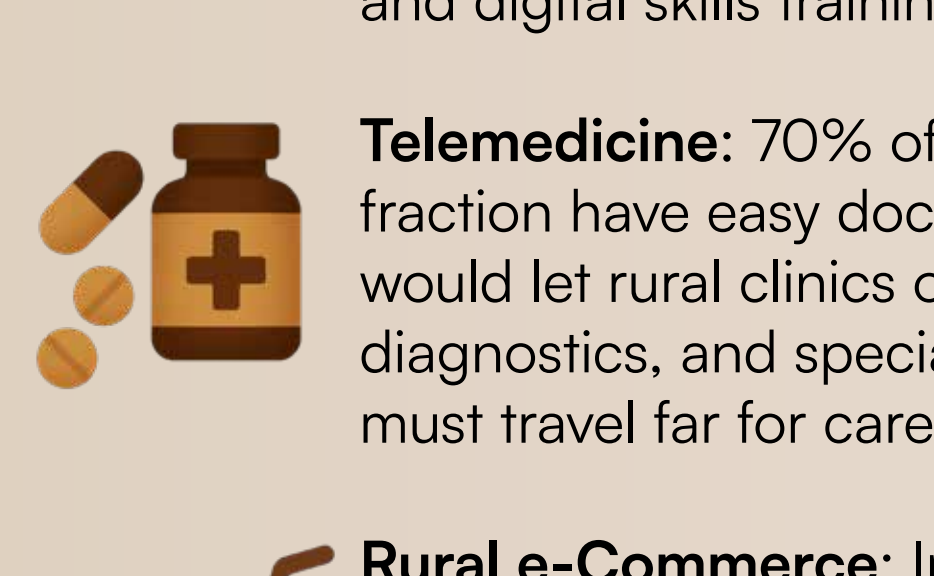

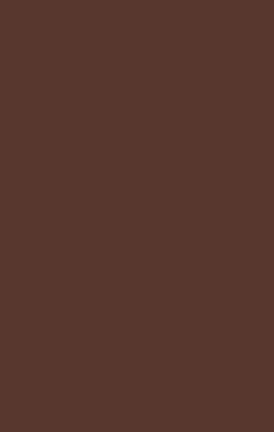


Bridging the Digital Divide

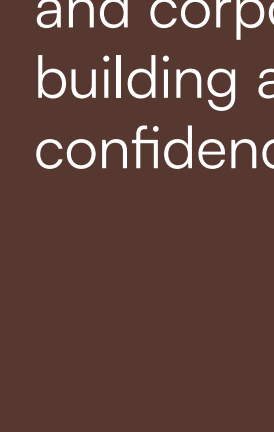
Satellite Internet's Promise

Did you know that well over half of India's population still lacks reliable internet access, especially in rural areas? This digital divide means many villages miss out on opportunities like online education, telehealth, and e-commerce. But a new era is dawning: satellite internet is poised to beam high-speed connectivity directly to remote villages. Using small satellites that orbit the Earth and require no ground cables, this technology makes it possible to reach even the most isolated communities.

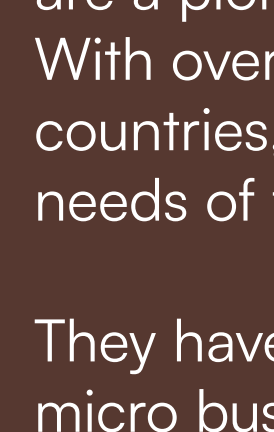
Why it matters:



Digital Education: Online learning can transform futures. Studies show each additional year of schooling can boost individual income by ~10% on average. With internet at home, rural students could tap into lectures, textbooks, and digital skills training they've never had before.



Telemedicine: 70% of Indians live in villages, but only a fraction have easy doctor access. Satellite broadband would let rural clinics offer live video consultations, remote diagnostics, and specialist advice to those who currently must travel far for care.



Rural e-Commerce: Imagine a farmer in Palghar selling produce across India online! Improved connectivity will allow rural entrepreneurs to list goods on digital marketplaces, dramatically expanding market reach and incomes.

We eagerly await this technology. Its success and affordable pricing could be a game-changer for thousands of our beneficiaries, opening new chapters in India's growth story.

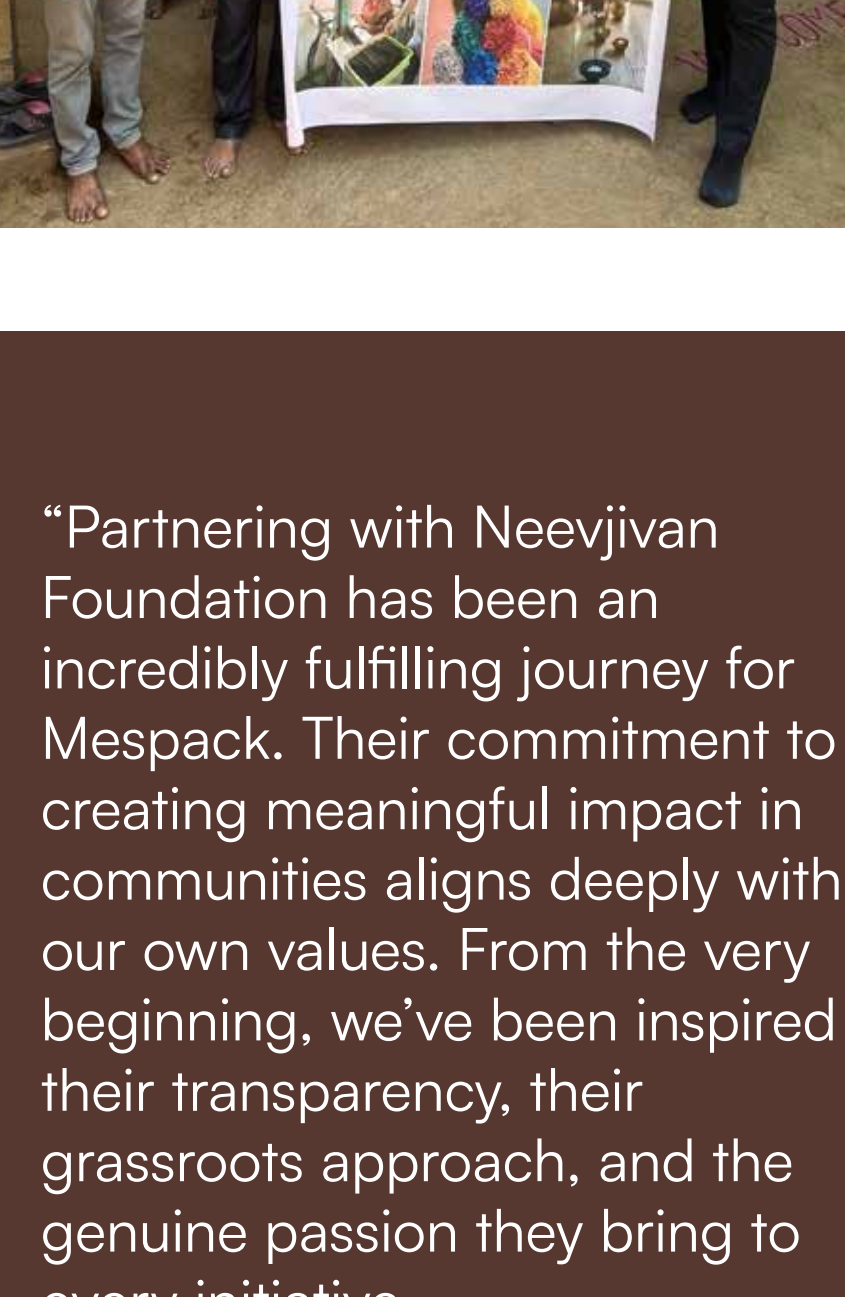

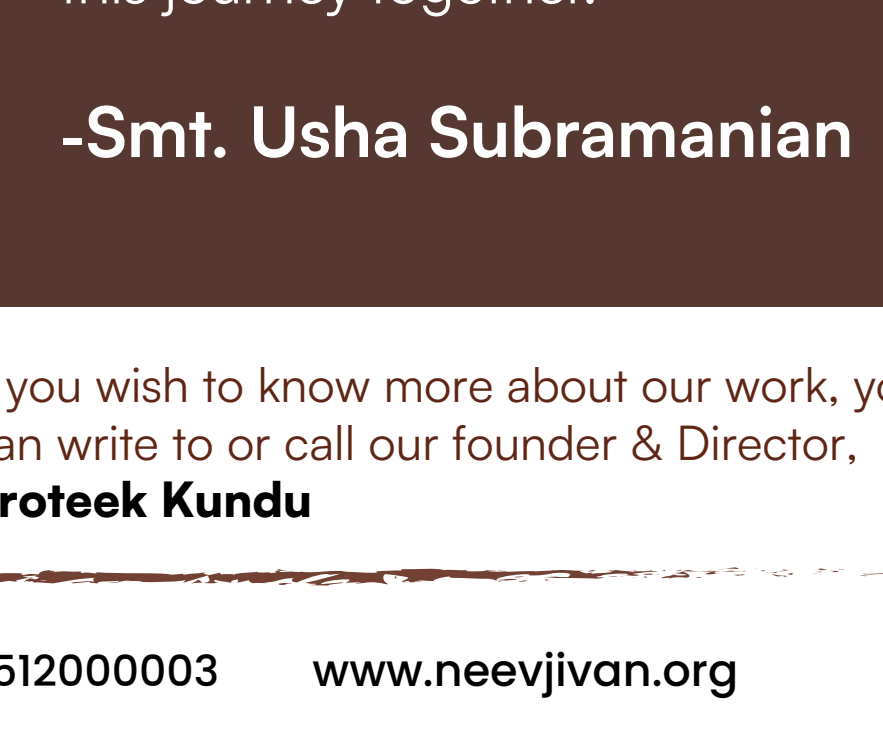
